MEETING WITH CARL HUSSEY OF CAPE DISPOSAL: E. N. Small provided a draft copy of a solid waste contract for review with Mr. Hussey. It was noted that the rate submitted by Cape Disposal is \$2.55 per household. This figure will increase annually by 2.75%. It was noted that the figures of Section 8 need to be update to reflect this. The number of 810 households is being use for contract purposes.

C. Hussey noted that although there is a set limit to the number of cans that can be collected at the curb, there is occasion where the workers will take more. Should this become a problem, the Town will be notified. Should there be a reported missed pick up, Cape Disposal should be contacted to alert the drivers in Town to pick up. C. Hussey also reviewed the holiday pick up schedule with the Board. It is essentially the same as it is now. He explained that collection cannot take place if the landfill is closed for a holiday; thus having no where to bring the collected trash. The collection day for the weeks these holidays fall will be Saturday.

C. Hussey stated that the plan is to begin collecting in Town at 6 a.m. with the collecting ending about 1 p.m. Two trucks will be assigned. He added that it takes approximately three weeks for drivers to become familiar with the new routes. Suggestion was made to notify the residents of the changes as a result of this new contract by way of the newsletter, flyer or other. C. Hussey indicated he would be willing to review the flyer information in advance of mailing.

Discussion of acceptable recyclables took place as well as the fact that Cape Disposal will pick up more than just one bin of recycling materials. He cautioned that only certain recyclables are acceptable and that this information should be part of the flyer. T. C. Tocci inquired as to an indication that recyclables are owned by Cape and that they are transferred within Mr. Hussey's yard. C. Hussey stated that this is so and explained the process in which he disposes of collected recyclables through Integrated Paper of North Andover. No permit is required to do so in this manner.

Cape Disposal is to service the cardboard recycling containers as well. C. Hussey stated that manageable, bound cardboard at the curbside will be collected. He cautioned that cardboard with food stains will not be collected, such as pizza boxes.

C. Hussey stated he is aware of the condition to submit a certificate of insurance to the Town. A discussion of liability took place at this time. Until such time as the collected trash is disposed of at a landfill, it is owned by the Town. C. Hussey assured the Board that he would be responsible for bringing the trash to the landfill.

In closing, C. Hussey stated he would take the draft contract and review it further and get back to E. N. Small with any concerns. The Board requested a document authorizing C. Hussey to sign on behalf of Cape Disposal.

The meeting adjourned at 5:00 p.m.
