2021 Hampton Falls Election

Hampton Falls voted to approve the School Board's recommended 2021-2022 operating budget, which was both a decrease from the 2020-2021 budget and lower than the default budget. We were able to recognize savings due to some reduced operations as a result of Covid-19.

We are thankful to the Hampton Falls community for the approval to utilize unexpended funds to contribute to the Special Education, Building Maintenance, and School Health Insurance Expendable Trusts, and safeguard our school and town from potential unanticipated or costly expenditures.

Residents also elected three seats to serve on the School Board. Both Jill Swasey and Anthony Lang were elected to continue the seats filled in 2020, and we welcome Barbara Goodman to the HFSB. Barbara has served for years on local and community non-profit committees and boards. She leads the HR and Finance Organization for North America for Paques Environmental Technologies Inc., and tries to keep up with her 3rd grade son. She will be an asset to the HFSB. Greg Parish was voted to continue to serve as Chair of the HFSB.

COVID-19 Update

Many SAU 21 staff are now fully vaccinated thanks to the time and dedication of the Hampton Falls, Hampton and North Hampton Fire Departments that dedicated their time over two weekends to administer the vaccination pods. Spotlight: Competency Based Education

LAS has joined SAU 21, and the state of New Hampshire, in a shift towards Competency Based Education (CBE). CBE is the process of working with students to define and transfer their content knowledge across disciplines or to solve different and unfamiliar problems. This approach has led to more authentic measurement and reporting of student learning, as well as efficient and effective instructional techniques.

Some key teacher planning elements that relate to CBE include:

- Defined Competencies and Supporting Standards- All courses have defined discrete standards and organized them into larger groups of transferrable skills that can be applied outside the classroom.
- Use of Performance Assessments- Performance assessments allow students to apply their learning to real world scenarios. Students demonstrate learning by designing, building, and creating.
- Instructional Design- Teachers engage in 'backwards planning,' allowing the standards and competencies to determine the nature of classroom activities, and allowing teachers to tailor support based on individual student needs.
- Integrated Habits of Learning- Habits of Learning include nonacademic behaviors such as communication, collaboration, selfdirection, and innovation that are essential for success outside the classroom.
