LATE 2018 DOG LICENSES

ALL DOGS IN TOWN SHOULD HAVE BEEN LICENSED BY APRIL 30 as required by state RSA 466:1. If you no longer own a dog(s), call 926-4618, Ext. 1, or e-mail us at townclerk@hamptonfalls.org; and we will remove your name from the list. **Otherwise, please license your dog(s) ASAP either in person or on-line to avoid the required call/visit from our dog officer** (written notifications of the additional \$25 per dog civil forfeiture (RSA 466:13) have already been sent. Rabies vaccination certificate(s) are only required if rabies expiration date has expired.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Please show photo I.D. for all motor vehicle transactions (for your insurance fraud protection).

-Renewals and transfers require the original, current registration(s) RSA 261:168 (copies are to be kept in your vehicle(s)).

-A notarized Power of Attorney is required when signing a title application for another person (even your spouse).

-Please allow time for processing your transactions by arriving as far in advance of our closing times of noon and 3:30 p.m. as possible (by 11:45 a.m. or 3:15 p.m. at the very latest).

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-A limit of 2 “regular” (renewals) vehicle transactions per person after 3:15 p.m. please. Financial closeouts are required daily at 3:30 p.m. Credit/debit card transactions are closed at 3:15 p.m.

-All transactions may be done through the mail if you can’t get in to our office (call 926-4618, Ext. 1 or E-mail us (townclerk@hamptonfalls.org) for instructions.

-Only ONE check required payable to “Town of Hampton Falls” which now includes town and state fees for your vehicle registration(s).

-All Major Credit/Debit Cards are accepted for payment. An additional credit/debit card fee (percentage of your total amount) applies to all card transactions.

Cash payments should be as close to the amount due as possible -- no large bills please (we keep limited cash).

INTERNET VEHICLE RENEWALS

We recommend completing your vehicle renewal(s) over the internet (E-Reg). Click on the plate link on the Town Clerk’s web page (www.hamptonfalls.org) for instructions, and you will receive your registration(s) and decal(s) through the mail. Renewals over 3 months late and residents wanting to make changes, complete transfers or obtain new plates will still need to come in to the office.

FILING FOR A MARRIAGE LICENSE

Please call ahead to schedule an early afternoon appointment when coming in to apply for a new marriage license. Limited staff prevents us from being able to process a license “on the spot.” The cost is \$50 and requires both persons’ I.Ds and final divorce or death certificates if filing for a subsequent marriage other than your first.

VITAL RECORDS AND 3-YEAR DUMP STICKERS ON-LINE

You can request “certified” copies of NH Birth, Death, Marriage and Divorce certificates on-line by choosing Vital Records on the town web page which will take you to EB2Gov for processing. Limited staff prevents us from being able to produce certified copies “on the spot.” Requests for self-cling, 3-year brush dump stickers are available on-line or from the Town Clerk’s office at a cost of \$30 each.

SEPTEMBER 11 PRIMARY AND NOVEMBER 6 GENERAL ELECTIONS

The State application for absentee ballots is available on the Town website for those registered voters who qualify. Absentee ballots for each election will become available approximately 2 – 3 weeks prior to each election.

TOWN CLERK’S OFFICE CLOSED FRIDAYS

A reminder that the Town Clerk’s office is closed on Fridays from June through December.

BUILDING INSPECTION – Mark Sikorski

Calls from residents and business owners alike are encouraged before starting any project. Please call 926-4618, ext. 5, or email buildinginspector@hamptonfalls.org. More than one resident has spent considerable time and money on engineered plans before they realized their proposed project would intrude into the wetlands buffer, setbacks from property lines, or other considerations, as defined by Hampton Falls Zoning Ordinances.

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Residents are encouraged to become familiar with these Ordinances which are available at the Town Hall or at www.hamptonfalls.org. All permit applications are available online as well.

On the Town Web site, on the left side of the home page, there is a link entitled Regulations. This is where you will find rules and regulations as to whether the project you have in mind is permitted. Projects in most cases require pre-approval by the Building Inspector, other town official or Board. With regard to the Town's right of way alongside most roadways, the Highway Agent and Building Inspector will notify owners of concerns immediately. The Town is not liable for damage to items placed in the Town right of way.

TAX COLLECTOR - Stephanie Grant

Property owners should have received their first property tax bill for 2018. The due date for the first bill is Tuesday, July 2. Please do **NOT** postdate your checks, by law the tax office cannot hold your payment until the posted date, this will result in the payment being mailed back and you could incur additional late charges. Credit/Debit card payments and electronic checks are accepted online for property taxes. Please be aware there is a 2.95% charge for all credit/debit transactions and a \$1.95 charge for checks. This is a bank **processing fee** and it is **not** charged or retained by the Town of Hampton Falls. You can pay/view your tax bill by visiting the home page at www.hamptonfalls.org and clicking on Property Taxes Review/Pay online button.

If you are among the people who like to pay bills on line, please be advised that we do not receive your payment the day that you "point and click." It usually takes a few days for the bank to process and **mail**, yes **mail**, your payment. Those who wait until the last minute to pay on line should be aware that we will receive your payment late and you will incur interest charges. Anyone seeking a receipt for payment by mail must include a self-addressed, **stamped** envelope and please make sure the envelope is big enough to put your receipt back into. Also, if you are considering applying for tax abatement; please wait until after receiving the October bill. If you have any questions about your assessment or your tax bill, please feel free to come into the office, or call at 926-4618, Ext. 4, or send an e-mail to taxcollector@hamptonfalls.org.

HAMPTON FALLS FIRE DEPARTMENT – Jay Lord, Fire Chief

Now that summer is upon us here are a few tips to remember as we all enjoy the reason we live in New England:

- The proper placement of grills are at least 5 feet away from the house or decking, and gas grills contribute to a higher number of fires than charcoal....so be careful.
- All portable fireplaces, chimeneas, etc. that are used in the yard require a fire permit for the season (good until Dec 31st) and must be 25 feet from a structure.
- A fireworks permits process was adopted by the Selectmen – permits are available on the Fire Department / Permits section of the town website hamptonfalls.org
- As summer storms are sometime very intense, remember the saying 'When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors.'
- Hydrate, Hydrate, Hydrate – if you're out in the sun and you are thirsty, you are already dehydrated, make sure you drink plenty of water prior and during the time in the sun.
- Don't forget about Fluffy and Fido.... they need shade and water also.
- Bike helmets should cover the forehead and sit level on the head. Fasten the chin strap so that two fingers fit between the strap and the chin.

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- Hurricane Season started June 1st have you made a plan?...YES, it CAN happen here, and it has... be prepared. More info at www.ReadyNH.gov.

HAMPTON FALLS HISTORICAL SOCIETY - Anne Sanborn Coombs, Secretary
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It is with great delight that the Historical Society is able to tell you that the repairs to the front portico of the Museum which have been mentioned in so many newsletters have been completed by Greg Patterson. The repairs did go into more detail as the rot went deeper than anticipated. It looks wonderful so please take a look as you drive by but better yet, stop in to visit during our summer hours. We will be open Saturdays from 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM starting June 16th. We always have 2 docents on hand to answer any questions as well as guide you through the Salt Marsh Haying Exhibition which is still ongoing as well as to answer questions about the history of Hampton Falls and items in our collection.

The original Boston Post Cane which is housed in a secure display case will be in the Museum for the summer and then be on display for the off season months at the Town Hall. In 1909, Edwin A. Grozier, Publisher of the Boston Post Newspaper gave a 14-carat gold-headed ebony cane to the Board of Selectmen in 700 towns in New England to be presented to the oldest male citizen of that town until his death. Eventually, women were allowed the honor of holding the cane. A replica was made which is what the town elder actually holds and that was presented to Mary Titus at the age of 95 in May of this year by the Selectmen. What an honor!

The Historical Society has been the recipient of some wonderful collectible items donated by Laura Batchelder, a descendent of Wallace and Florence Batchelder of Hampton Falls. We always appreciate collectibles from the families that established Hampton Falls and the name Batchelder is well ingrained in our history. Our membership drive was a wonderful success and we heartily thank you for your dues and donations. These monies are what help the Society to maintain the Museum and support our efforts to “....illuminate the history of Hampton Falls and its people”. Summer Reading for Adults: You are welcome and encouraged to participate in the summer reading program for adults. For each book you read, you earn a raffle ticket which can be placed in the prize bucket of your choice.
