PROGRAMS

Songs of Emigration: Storytelling through Traditional Irish Music

Earth Day Fair

Wednesday, April 22 from 5-7 p.m. In honor of the 50th anniversary of Earth Day, the Library has invited representatives from a dozen organizations concerned with the environment. Learn about solar energy, well water testing, beach cleanup, marine mammal rescue, pollinators, and organic gardening, to name a few. There will also be demonstrations of crafts repurposing common materials, door prizes, and activities for children.

COMING SOON- NEW MUSEUM PASSES

The Friends of the Library have generously funded two additional museum passes – The Portland Museum of Art in Portland, Maine and the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum in Boston. The pass to the Portland Museum of Art will admit two adults for free and people under 21 are always free. The pass to the Gardner will admit up to four people for \$5 each. Persons under 18 are free. The Friends have continued to sponsor passes to the Currier Museum of Art, the Wright Museum of World War II in Wolfeboro, Strawbery Banke, NH State Parks, and Historic New England. The Library also offers passes to the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston and the American Independence Museum in Exeter.

On Thursday, April 30, the group will welcome back baseball with Last Days of Summer by Steve Kluger.

Set in Brooklyn in the 1940's, <u>Last Days of Summer</u> is the story of Joey Margolis, neighborhood punching bag, growing up goofy and mostly fatherless. A boy looking for a hero, Joey decides to latch on to Charlie Banks, the all-star third basemen for the New York Giants. But Joey's chosen champion doesn't exactly welcome the extreme attention of a persistent young fan with an overactive imagination.
