PARKING BAN AND SNOW REMOVAL

Townspeople are reminded that effective December 15, no overnight parking (6 p.m. to 6 a.m.) is allowed on any town roadway. This ban will be in effect until April 1. A Selectmen's ordinance prohibits the plowing of snow onto public roads. It includes a fine for any person causing snow or ice to be placed upon the surfaces of the traveled portion of the road.

- -Renewals and transfers require the original, current registration(s) RSA 261:168 (copies are to be kept in your vehicle(s).
- -A <u>notarized Power of Attorney</u> is required when signing a title application for another person (even your spouse).
- -Please allow time for processing your transactions by arriving as far in advance of our closing times of noon and 3:30 p.m. as possible (by 11:45 a.m. or 3:15 p.m. at the very latest).
- -A limit of 2 "regular" (renewals) vehicle transactions per person after 3:15 p.m. please. Financial closeouts are required daily at 3:30 p.m. Credit/debit card transactions are closed at 3:15 p.m.
- -All transactions may be done through the mail if you can't get in to our office (call 926-4618, Ext. 1 or E-mail us (townclerk@hamptonfalls.org) for instructions.
- <u>-Only ONE check is required</u> payable to "Town of Hampton Falls" which now includes town and state fees for your vehicle registration(s).
- <u>-All Major Credit/Debit Cards</u> are accepted for payment. An additional credit/debit card fee (percentage of your total amount) applies to all card transactions.

<u>Cash payments</u> should be as close to the amount due as possible -- no large bills please (we keep limited cash).

INTERNET VEHICLE RENEWALS

We recommend completing your vehicle renewal(s) over the internet (E-Reg). Click on the Town Clerk's web page (www.hamptonfalls.org), motor vehicles, plate link for instructions, and you will receive your registration(s) and decal(s) through the mail. Renewals over 3 months late and residents wanting to make changes, complete transfers or obtain new plates will still need to come in to the office.

FILING FOR A MARRIAGE LICENSE

Please call ahead to schedule an early afternoon appointment when coming in to apply for a new marriage license. Limited staff prevents us from being able to process a license "on the spot." The cost is \$50 and requires both persons' I.Ds and final divorce or death certificates if filing for a subsequent marriage other than your first.

VITAL RECORDS AND 3-YEAR - DUMP STICKERS ON-LINE

You can request "certified" copies of NH Birth, Death, Marriage and Divorce certificates on-line by choosing Vital Records on the town web page which will take you to EB2Gov for processing. Limited staff prevents us from being able to produce certified copies "on the spot." Requests for self-cling, 3-year brush dump stickers are available on-line or from the Town Clerk's office at a cost of \$30 each.

BUILDING INSPECTION/HEALTH OFFICER - Mark Sikorski

With winter upon us, it is time to get ready for the cold, snow and ice. Please consider the following suggestions. Some residents have issues with ice dams. Now is the time to address that issue before it gets too cold to attach heating cables to the roof possibly causing more damage. An electrical outlet needs to be installed close to the element as extension cords are only for limited temporary use. This outlet must be GFI protected. If the outlet is outdoors it must also have a weatherproof cover installed.

Does your home have a standby power generator? Check over your equipment for proper operation. There is nothing worse than trying to start the generator after the power goes out without success. Review the area set aside for generator operation. Is it free of flammable debris? Is it far enough away from your home's windows and doors to allow fumes to safely dissipate?

Time to get your heating appliances serviced to avoid failure causing pipes to burst and expensive damage to your home.

It is important to keep wood and pellet stoves clean. Good dry hardwood along with keeping creosote to a minimum is essential to a safe warm wood stove fire. Pellet stoves are easy to keep clean. One part that is critical to safe operation is the auger. It is important to clean out any stuck pellets and dust. If you have questions or concerns, you can check with stove dealers that can help answer questions or make repairs.

Now that all of these winter appliances are ready to run, take a walk around the home and check out your smoke alarm system. If you don't already have one, make it a point to purchase and install a reliable carbon monoxide detector. If your home already contains interconnected smoke alarms you may update the system and add carbon monoxide units into the mix. The units should be located just outside the sleeping areas to alert occupants of this odorless killer. Additional CO detectors on all levels will increase your protection. Winter well and be safe.

Gutters need to be cleaned. Please keep safety in mind when using ladders. Another item to keep in mind before the ground freezes is to have your septic tank pumped and checked.

Reminder: Hampton Falls has adopted a Historic Demolition Delay ordinance that affects any structure 75 years and older. The ordinance can be viewed in its entirety on line at hamptonfalls.org. It is in the Building Code, page 2, Section 4.

TAX COLLECTOR - Stephanie Grant

The tax rate has been set at \$19.90 for 2018. Tax bills will be mailed and will be due thirty days from the date on which the bills are mailed. Please look for the due date on the bill. Please keep the top portion of the bill for your records and detach the bottom portion to return with your payment. Please note that the Tax Office will be closed on Thursday, December 27th.

Tax bills can also be viewed/printed and paid online at www.hamptonfalls.org, on the right side of the home page. Please be aware there is a 2.95% charge for credit/debit transactions and a \$0.95 for ACH transactions. This is a bank processing fee and is not retained or charged by the Town of Hampton Falls. Please let us know if you have moved, changed your name, or are now using a PO Box so that we can get your tax bill to you in a timely fashion.

Read your tax bill thoroughly as it contains important information such as the hours that the tax office is open, the tax bill due date, the interest rate on late payments, your assessment, and exemption and/or tax credit information. The tax office hours are Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Please note that if you pay after 3 p.m. on the due date, your payment is considered late.

When using on-line bill pay through your bank- please select a 'pay date' that is earlier than the due date. Some institutions do not cut the check until the 'pay date,' so if you use the due date as the 'pay date' we won't receive the payment on time and you will be charged interest. Please make sure your

payment is not post-dated, the Tax Office is not allowed by law to hold tax payments. If you send in a postdated check, it will be returned and could result in a late fee. Whether you pay your taxes by mail or leave it in the drop box to the left of the outside door and would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope. We now have a drop box to the right of the Tax Collector's window too, for your convenience. Again, we require a self-addressed, stamped envelope if you would like a receipt. Checks cannot be post-dated or they will be returned. *Thank you*.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY - Anne Coombs, Secretary

The Historical Society is teaming up with the Tercentennial Committee for the writing of the book updating the history of Hampton Falls starting in 1917 where Warren Brown left off. The Society has appropriated \$15,000 as seed money to get the project underway. Collin Garcia, a young man with excellent credentials and skills, will be doing the writing and layout.

The Historical Society Annual Meeting was held Tuesday, October 16, 2018. We had a nice turn out of attendees for our meeting and program "10,000 Years in Hampton Falls." Jacob Tumelaire, Archeologist was our guest speaker. Jake is with a local Archeological Consulting firm, and has been researching our collection of Indian artifacts found in the growing fields behind the old Edgerly Farm homestead along Depot Road. The collection dates back 10,000 years to the Paleo-Indian period. Jake was a great speaker and very enthusiastic about the collection which is still a work in progress. Our gracious thanks are extended to Jake and his partner Mark Greenly, who is a former President of the New Hampshire Archeological Society, for their work and efforts with this project.

During the Board meeting, Tracy Healy-Beattie and David French were voted onto the Board of Trustees of the Society. They are both former members, and we welcome them back. Officers of the Board will be voted in at the next Society meeting on November 13th in the Museum at 6:45 p.m. All are welcome to attend.

The Museum is now closed for the season but can be opened by appointment. The Board will continue to work on cataloging the collection and improving the interior during the off season. We meet the second Tuesday of each month in the Museum at 6:45 p.m. and all are welcome to join us. New members of the Society are always needed to help with the constant "work in progress." Those of you who are interested, please visit a meeting and see what we are all about.

By now, you will have received your Annual Appeal card in the mail. We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit entity and receive no tax based revenue to support our operational costs. Your donations and dues will help cover the cost of the funds appropriated to the Tercentennial Committee for the book writing. The 300th Anniversary in 2022 will be an exciting time for us all, and we certainly want the book to be amazing! Thanking you in advance for your generosity.
