#### LATE 2018 DOG LICENSES

<u>ALL DOGS IN TOWN SHOULD HAVE BEEN LICENSED BY APRIL 30</u> as required by state RSA 466:1. If you no longer own a dog(s), call 926-4618, Ext. 1, or e-mail us at townclerk@hamptonfalls.org; and we will remove your name from the list.

Otherwise, **please license your dog(s) ASAP** either in person or on-line to avoid the required call/visit from our dog officer (written notifications of the additional \$25 per dog civil forfeiture (RSA 466:13) have already been sent). Rabies vaccination certificate(s) are only required if rabies expiration date has expired.

#### VEHICLE REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Please show photo I.D. for all motor vehicle transactions (for your insurance fraud protection).

-Renewals and transfers require the original, current registration(s) RSA 261:168 (copies are to be kept in your vehicle(s).

-A <u>notarized Power of Attorney</u> is required when signing a title application for another person (even your spouse).

-Please allow time for processing your transactions by arriving as far in advance of our closing times of noon and 3:30 p.m. as possible (by 11:45 a.m. or 3:15 p.m. at the very latest).

-A limit of 2 "regular" (renewals) vehicle transactions per person after 3:15 p.m. please. Financial closeouts are required daily at 3:30 p.m. Credit/debit card transactions are closed at 3:15 p.m.

-All transactions may be done through the mail if you can't get in to our office (call 926-4618, Ext. 1 or E-mail us (townclerk@hamptonfalls.org) for instructions.

<u>-Only ONE check required</u> payable to "Town of Hampton Falls" which now includes town and state fees for your vehicle registration(s).

<u>-All Major Credit/Debit Cards</u> are accepted for payment. An additional credit/debit card fee (percentage of your total amount) applies to all card transactions.

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<u>Cash payments</u> should be as close to the amount due as possible -- no large bills please (we keep limited cash).

#### **INTERNET VEHICLE RENEWALS**

We recommend completing your vehicle renewal(s) over the internet (E-Reg). Click on the plate link on the Town Clerk's web page (<u>www.hamptonfalls.org</u>) for instructions, and you will receive your registration(s) and decal(s) through the mail. Renewals over 3 months late and residents wanting to make changes, complete transfers or obtain new plates will still need to come in to the office.

#### FILING FOR A MARRIAGE LICENSE

Please call ahead to schedule an early afternoon appointment when coming in to apply for a new marriage license. Limited staff prevents us from being able to process a license "on the spot." The cost is \$50 and requires both persons' I.Ds and final divorce or death certificates if filing for a subsequent marriage other than your first.

#### VITAL RECORDS AND 3-YEAR DUMP STICKERS ON-LINE

You can request "certified" copies of NH Birth, Death, Marriage and Divorce certificates on-line by choosing Vital Records on the town web page which will take you to EB2Gov for processing. Limited staff prevents us from being able to produce certified copies "on the spot." Requests for self-cling, 3-year brush dump stickers are available on-line or from the Town Clerk's office at a cost of \$30 each.

#### **SEPTEMBER 11 PRIMARY AND NOVEMBER 6 GENERAL ELECTIONS**

The State application for absentee ballots is available on the Town website. Absentee ballots for the September 11 Primary are now available for registered voters who qualify.

**YARD SALE PERMIT REMINDER:** Please allow at least one week of advance time for approval of a yard sale application. Should you have questions with regard to yard sale permit processing, contact Building Inspector Mark Sikorski. Applications can be obtained at the Town Hall or from the Town's website.

The Town of Hampton Falls ordinance with regard to yard sales (garage sales, barn sales, tent sales, moving sales) includes, but is not limited to, the following requirements that are verified by the Building Inspector at the time of application:

 $\Box$  A yard sale permit, at no charge, shall be issued for up to two yard sales in a calendar year and must be held on the property owned by the applicant.

 $\Box$  The duration of the permit is for no more than two successive days, with the time of start to be specified on the application, including rain date(s).

 $\Box$  Yard Sale signs must meet the Town's sign ordinance and shall be removed at the close of the yard sale.

 $\Box$  The yard sale shall not approach to less than 25 feet from any road or street.

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#### HISTORICAL SOCIETY -- ANNE COOMBS, SECRETARY

Due to the generosity of the Edgerly Family of Hampton Falls, we have a very nice size collection of Indian artifacts which were actually discovered in the fields around the Edgerly Farm which was on Route 1 across from the Common with fields going down Depot Road. Jacob Tumelaire, Archaeologist with an archaeological consulting firm has been cataloging the collection. He was able to tell us that the Society's collection includes projectile points and tools from millennia of regional prehistory and that two of the scrapers date to the Paleo-Indian period roughly 10,000 years ago! The Society's Annual Meeting will be held Tuesday evening October 16<sup>th</sup> in the Museum, and we have invited Jacob to be our speaker and present the collection. This is such an exciting piece of history to have in our possession. The Annual Meeting with speaker is open to the public at no charge, and we hope you will join us for this unveiling. Children are welcome.

As mentioned in the last newsletter, Laura Batchelder, a descendent of Wallace and Florence Batchelder, donated boxes of family collectibles. We have been going through these to catalogue them and have enjoyed many Batchelder family pictures from over the years. We have also received a collection of documents, pictures, etc. from the Farley Family. These have not been viewed except for the large oil painting of the Grist Mill in Sudbury, Mass. We always appreciate collectibles from the families that established Hampton Falls. These are what help support our efforts to "....illuminate the history of Hampton Falls and its people."

The Museum is open Saturdays from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM until October  $6^{th}$ . Please stop in to view and enjoy what your donations and membership dues support. We are a 501(c)(3) non-profit entity and receive no tax based revenue to support our operational costs. Your support is needed and much appreciated. ## HERITAGE COMMITTEE - BEVERLY MUTRIE, CHAIR

In order to clear up any confusion about the differences between the Heritage Commission and the Historical Society, we submit the following:

The Hampton Falls Heritage Commission's focus is "to inspire and encourage preservation of the heritage of Hampton Falls." According to RSA 674:44-a, the purpose of a Heritage Commission is "for the proper recognition, use and protection of resources, tangible or intangible, primarily manmade, that are valued for their historic, cultural, aesthetic, or community significance." The voters approved forming our Heritage Commission and a Heritage Fund at the same time in March 2008. According to RSA 673:4-a, the Board of Selectmen appoints 5 residents as Commissioners, one of which must be a Selectman. Each member serves for 3 years and up to five alternates can be appointed. Generally, we advise and assist other local boards and commissions, conduct inventories, educate the public on historical resources, and serve as a resource for revitalization efforts. A Heritage Commission can also accept and expend funds in a non-lapsing heritage fund, acquire and manage property, and hold preservation easements. Our Heritage Commission is also charged with ruling on any Demolition Permit of an historic structure. Our current Commission members are, Beverly Mutrie, Chair, David French, Vice-Chair, Mary Ann Hill and Phil Chura. Jim Ziolkowski is the Selectman/Commissioner.

#### **BOARD OF SELECTMEN**

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In contrast, the Hampton Falls Historical Society was established in 1984 as a private non-profit organization, with dues paying members. Its eleven or so member Board of Trustees is elected for three year terms at an annual meeting in October. It then appoints its officers from the new Board of Trustees. Its basic purpose is to "Investigate, Collect, Preserve, Elucidate and Communicate whatsoever may relate to the history of Hampton Falls." The Society meets monthly and accepts donations of money, as well as ephemera and artifacts for their Museums, the old East Schoolhouse and what was the old Library Building. The East Schoolhouse, next to the Library, is owned by the Society, whereas the Museum is leased from the town.

At the moment, the Heritage Commission is diligently compiling a survey of Hampton Falls' Historic Resources including monuments, markers, cemeteries and buildings. This survey will hopefully be complete by 2022 and will be published to celebrate our Tricentennial. We hope everyone will allow us to photograph their historic property and would answer questions we have about its past. As always, we welcome alternates and interested residents to help with this task.
