Residential Recycling and Solid Waste Services Guide

This Service Guide contains important dates and collection information, please read and keep this information January 1 - June 30, 2020.

Curbside Collection of Trash & Recyclables

Curbside collection of trash and recyclables occurs on Fridays for all residents. Residents may place up to four (4) 30-gallon covered cans, or the equivalent in sealed bags of trash, curbside for collection each week. All cans must be covered and otherwise properly secured.

The Town may provide one (1) recycling bin for the storage and collection of single stream recycling (details on following page) to each new household. Additional or replacement bins may be obtained at the Hampton Falls Town Hall for a fee. Residents may utilize larger, rigid containers marked "recyclables" if preferred, as there is no limit to the amount of recyclables allowed curbside each week.

Please have your material out for collection by 6:00 am on Friday mornings. Should you not have your material out on time, and therefore miss collection, you may bring your **recyclables only** to the Brush Dump (Saturdays 8:00 - 2:00, April - November) and place them in the so-marked container.

Holiday Collection Schedule

Curbside collection of trash and recyclables will only be affected by holidays which fall on collection day (Friday). In the event a holiday falls on a Friday, collection will be delayed by one day, occurring on Saturday:

Major holidays that fall on Fridays, will have holiday-related delays in service this year.

Items Prohibited from Curbside Collection

The curbside collection program is for the collection and disposal of regularly-generated household trash. The following items will not be collected as part of this program. You can find details on how to dispose of any such items, and any associated costs (if applicable), on the following pages.

White Goods such as refrigerators, washing machines, hot water heaters, dryers, and appliances

Industrial, commercial, construction, and demolition debris

Yard waste such as stumps, leaves, brush, branches, and wood

Bulky items such as sofas, chairs, televisions, rugs, air conditioners, mattresses

Hazardous Materials such as paints, solvents, thinners, pesticides, weed killers, poisons, dry cell batteries

Recycling in Hampton Falls

The Town of Hampton Falls collects single stream recycling at the curb every week on Fridays, and our Single Stream Program makes recycling at home easier than ever! All recyclable material - office paper, plastics, tin cans, newspapers, cardboard - all go in the same bin. To limit the amount of material sent to the landfill, it is important for residents to recycle as much material as possible, while taking care to only place acceptable items in your bin. Recycling loads that are contaminated with "unacceptable" items are rejected at the processing center, resulting in charges to the town. Please do your part to keep Hampton Falls' recycling contamination-free.

The Town provides each new household with a recycling bin free of charge, and additional or replacement bins may be available for a small fee at the Town Hall. You may also use any rigid container, such as a laundry basket, for curbside collection, provided it is clearly marked as "recycling." **There is NO LIMIT to the number of recycling containers you can place at the curb each week!**

RECYCLE RIGHT!

Recycling rules have changed. What you think you know may not be accurate. Many items that may have recycle value, are not allowed in the Single Stream mix. Just because an item is Metal, Paper, Glass or has a triangle on it, doesn't make it acceptable. Here are some simple guidelines that should help you to Recycle Right.

The largest source of contamination is plastic bags, styrofoam, and food waste.

When in doubt, go to www.RecycleSmartNH.org Enter in the item to find out if it's recycling or trash!

Because of global changes to recycling, the industry has changed how they describe what can and can't be recycled in residential programs. They have moved away from the "look for the symbol," and "1-7" terminology, and instead are spelling out the TYPES of items that are included in the program.

The Brush Dump

Corner of Drinkwater and Parsonage Roads
Open Saturdays, April 1-November 30 (except July 4 weekend)
8:00 am - 2:00 pm
(except on Spring and Fall Cleanup Days)

Items Accepted at The Brush Dump

- Brush, grass and leaves ONLY
- Brush up to 5" in diameter
- Dispose of brush in the designated area. Align cut ends to expedite chipping.
- Dispose of leaves and grasses in separate designated area.

Items NOT allowed at Brush Dump

- Stumps
- Hazardous household waste
- Metal such as nails, fencing, etc. (damages the chipper)
- Building material (studs, boards, etc.)

Rules for the Disposal of Used Petroleum Oil

- Only residents of Hampton Falls may participate in this program.
- Residents must call 926-5752 for an appointment Monday - Thursday **BEFORE** delivering the used oil.
- Used oil must be brought in clear containers, no larger than 5 gallons.
- Residents must include name and phone on the container. (Stickers will be provided).
- The Town-appointed agent will inspect the used oil before accepting it for disposal.

Dump Sticker Required:

New dump stickers can be purchased at the Town Clerk's Office for a cost of \$30 per 3-year sticker.

White Goods & Bulky Items

Household Cleanup Days

Cleanup of household waste, to include white goods and bulky items, is held twice a year; once in the spring (typically May or June) from 8:00 - 2:00 pm and once in the fall (typically October), from 8:00 - noon at the Hampton Falls Brush Dump, at the Corner of Drinkwater and Parsonage Roads. There are fees for disposal of certain items, which are subject to change.

Dump Stickers are no longer required to participate in the Spring and Fall Cleanup, but residents will be charged a per-trip fee (see Fee Schedule.)

White Goods are appliances, such as refrigerators, washing machines, hot water heaters, dryers, etc.

Electronics Recycling: A container is available for the recycling of electronics at a fee of \$20 per item. Items acceptable for recycling include: computers, fax machines, scanners, mainframes, VCR/DVD players, stereos, monitors, printers, telecommunications equipment, speakers and wire. Projection televisions are accepted at a fee of \$35 each.

Bulky Items include large items, such as sofas, chairs, rugs, air conditioners, mattresses. Wood that is clean, untreated and able to be burned is also acceptable at a charge per vehicle size:

Auto/SUV \$10	Large Truck \$20
6' Bed Pickup \$10	6' Trailer \$10
8' Bed Pickup \$15 (w/sideboards add \$5)	12' Trailer \$20

NO BRUSH, STUMPS, CONSTRUCTION, DEMOLITION OR HAZARDOUS WASTE ARE ACCEPTED ON HOUSEHOLD WASTE COLLECTION DAYS (WHITE GOODS DAYS).

There is a \$25 fee for disposal of freon and there is a \$5 fee to dispose of 5, 10, and 20-pound propane tanks and a \$20 fee to dispose of 30, 40, or 100 pound tanks. Effective 7/1/20 mattresses will be \$35.00 each.
